Equipping

We enable and equip Native Christian leaders to go where they feel God is calling them. It may be to a reservation, to speak at a conference, or to go to a prison. We can provide travel expenses, Bibles, and other resources they may need or want to use. It is always a privilege to help dedicated, gifted men and women “put on their shoes” and spread the gospel as the Native American Christian leaders God has created them to be.

Outreach & Programs

Our outreach efforts are primarily at the pow wows. We give away Creator Speaks New Testaments, Four Directions tracts, and other Native Christian resources. We use Native worship CDs, books, and more to raise donations at these events and others.

In addition, Polished Arrow has 3 annual programs that we participate in annually. One is in support of youth rallies hosted by First Youth Nations. Polished Arrow brings backpacks filled with school supplies, encouraging words, and Sacred Road books.

The second one is in support of the Native American Veterans Association (NAVA) Pow Wow each year in South Gate, CA. We take “thank-you bags” for the veterans and fill them with groceries, gift cards, and Sacred Road books.

Finally, we participate again with First Youth Nations in their annual Christmas party. We provides toys, dancers, and speakers. Native youth on/off reservations come as far away as Arizona for this event.

Joseph & Martha Manzo

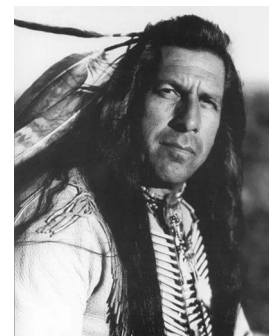
